# **Thoughts From Our Pastor**

Friends, arL None of us likes change. This is all the more true for those of us who continue to attend church — or for that matter synagogue, temple, or mosque. Our "religions" are seen by the outside world as a throwback to an earlier time, a solution to the spiritual hungers of the past. We are seen as being afraid to accept the changes brought on by science and postmodernity. And we would be foolish to deny that there is some truth to this. We are more adverse to change than most people, and I, who have staked not only my soul but my mortgage on the old order, am chief among those who resist change. But whether we like it or not, the old lines are blurring: the merger has begun.

When my grandfather served his last church, his world was divided into two camps: Polish Catholic and Italian Catholic. Each had its own congregations, schools, drug stores, bodegas, civic organizations, doctors, etc. The lines were sharp, clear, and generally accepted. When I served that same parish, the lines between Catholics had disappeared because the world around them no longer accepted them; the parishes simply had to follow suit. If my daughter serves that parish, I have no doubt that her "church" will be a religious center with members who used to call themselves Protestant, Catholic, Jewish, Muslim, and Hindu.

Over a decade ago, Pope Benedict visited a mosque. He was the first pope ever to do so, and he essentially said that there is no real



difference between Christians and Muslims. President Trump, on his recent trip through the Middle East, added Jews to the recipe. Do we have the choice to see ourselves as different than these other faiths? From any other faith? Only as long as the world will allow it. Within a hundred years, there will be theists and nontheists — because those will be the only categories that the larger world will understand.

This summer, Elizabeth and I are spending three weeks at a conference on the practicalities of how this merger, chosen or not, will take place, in a city that has long experience in how this unfolds: Istanbul. I am excited by what I am going to learn, but also admittedly sad that the distinctions upon which I have built my whole life are quietly fading.
